Laptop performances by Bernhard Gál

In addition to his work as a composer and installation artist, Bernhard Gál also performs live, using a laptop computer along with additional electronic devices. Gál's solo concerts are comprised of elements from recent music and art projects as well as new field recordings, which he takes apart and reassembles in a quasi-improvised, live context. In many cases, the performances also reflect the respective concert venue, with its distinctive acoustic and sociocultural characteristics. Since 2002, Gál has given around 200 concerts on five continents and has worked in ongoing collaborations with other musicians, e.g. with Kai Fagaschinski, Jennifer Walshe, Tung Chao-Ming and Belma Beslic-Gál. In 2008, the audio CD relive was released on Gromoga Records, being the first 'official' audio documentation of Gal's laptop performances. Recently, he has also started presenting audio fragments from his latest cd release same difference in a live context. Furthermore, Gal continues to present performances and installations of the intermedia project textur, a series of audio-visual works combining phonography and photography.

Owed to his multifaceted and interdisciplinary artistic approach, Austrian artist, composer and musicologist Bernhard Gál is is equally at home within the domains of contemporary music, installation art and media art. As of now, Gál has created around 70 sound installations and intermedia art projects, combining sound, light, objects, spatial concepts and video projections into intense and prevalently site-specific art works. He also composes music for acoustic instruments and electroacoustic music. As a (laptop) musician he has been performing extensively on five continents. He runs the art production hub 'Gromoga' and serves as the artistic director of the Austrian art organization 'sp ce'. Currently, Gál lives as an artist, composer and researcher in Vienna and Salzburg. His work has been presented in concerts, sound installations, exhibitions, and radio portraits around the world. For his music and art projects Gál has received numerous awards, his music has been made available on some 30 audio publications.
